
During the interim period (January 1 – June 30, 2025), we made steady progress on the key initiatives of our Medium-Term Management Plan (2022–2028)—namely, "Cloud Penetration" and "Service Expansion"—and remain on track to achieve our full-year targets.

In addition, we are advancing the "Grow Leaf Project," an environmental conservation initiative carried out with the participation of our customers and other stakeholders. By joining forces with many who share the project's vision, we are engaging in initiatives that would be difficult to accomplish by individuals or companies alone.

Second Quarter (Interim) Performance Highlights



The consolidated results for the interim period (January 1 – June 30, 2025) were revenue of JPY 9,819 million, up 16.6% year on year, and operating profit of JPY 771 million, compared with an operating loss of JPY 44 million in the same period of the previous year. Both revenue and operating profit exceeded the forecasts announced on February 7, 2025. Revenue outperformed expectations mainly due to steady customer migration to our cloud software and stronger-than-anticipated demand for PC replacements driven by security enhancements. In addition, the use of generative AI in sales and administrative operations enabled us to review business processes and achieve greater-than-planned cost optimization. As a result, operating profit also exceeded expectations

Q2 What revisions have been made to the full-year forecast, and what are the reasons for these changes?

In the second half (July 1 – December 31, 2025), demand for PC replacements is expected to remain solid. However, for customers applying IT subsidies to cloud software usage fees, the timing of subsidy disbursement has in some cases delayed the transition to cloud software. Taking this into account, we are maintaining our full-year revenue forecast of JPY 20.1 billion.

On the profit side, reflecting the cost situation through the interim period, we have revised our operating profit forecast upward by JPY 100 million to JPY 1.6 billion (up 137.4% year on year). Net profit attributable to owners of the parent remains unchanged at JPY 1.0 billion (up 191.3%), taking into

Regarding the migration of customers to our cloud software, while some implementations were postponed due to the timing of IT subsidies, orders have been progressing steadily. In particular, medium- and large-sized enterprise customers have shown strong willingness to shift to cloud environments, and we expect further expansion through implementation support and the provision of additional features.

Having completed the planned deficit phase, we have now entered a new stage of generating profits from this fiscal year. We will continue striving to





What is the 'Grow Leaf Project'?

Launched in 2008, the "Grow Leaf Project" is a corporate participation initiative that embodies the aspirations embedded in our company name, aiming to contribute to the global environment in ways that cannot be achieved by a single company alone.

Together with member companies who share our vision, we carry out a variety of activities, including tree-planting through "Present Tree," a forest restoration project operated by Environmental Relations Research Institute, and hosting the "Satoyama BONSAI Workshop," which uses broadleaf seedlings cultivated by people with disabilities to create bonsai online.









What is "Present Tree"?

"Present Tree" is a project launched in January 2005 to link forest regeneration with regional revitalization. The initiative involves planting trees in areas such as former development sites, abandoned clear-cut lands, and disaster-affected forests across Japan—locations that have been increasing due to declining birthrates and an aging population. People from the Tokyo metropolitan area become foster parents of these trees and, together with local residents, nurture them as commemorative trees for ten years. Through this process, the project aims not only to restore forests but also to revitalize local communities.becoming foster parents of these trees and nurturing commemorative trees while interacting with local people for 10 years, aiming to invigorate not only the forest but also the community.
